



What YOU need to know about NC's new voter bill

Starting Now

No pre-registration for 16- or 17-year-olds; must be 18 by election day to register (and meet 25-day deadline before election)

Registration rolls purged to delete names of people who are deceased or registered in another state

Starting January 2014

No paid registration drives

No same-day registration

No straight-party voting

No out-of-precinct voting

No instant runoff

No extending Election Day poll hours by county Boards of Election, only by state BOE

Changes to absentee voting

Reduced Early Voting –10 days instead of 17 days

Additional poll observers for political parties

Challenges to votes by any county voter

Starting January 2016

Voter ID Requirement Begins

Valid IDs are:

| 1) NC driver's license | 4) US military or veteran ID |
| 2) NC non-driver ID | 5) Tribe enrollment card |
| 3) US passport | 6) Out-of-state driver's ID only within 90 days after registration |

NO student IDs

NO expired IDs *(Voters over 70 years old may use expired ID if valid when voter turned 70)*

No Photo ID necessary for (1) those with religious objections; (2) curbside voters; (3) victims of natural disaster within 60 days of election (those who are exempted must still show some proof of identity and residency)

Starting January 2018

All Touch Screens must produce a paper ballot that is the voter's official record.
