



Top 10 Changes Under the New Voting Law... That Aren't Voter ID

- 1 **No Same-Day Registration:** Everyone has to be registered 25 days before election to be eligible to vote. (Jan. 2014)
- 2 **Fewer Early Voting Days:** Reduced from 17 to 10 Early Voting days but extended hours. (Jan. 2014)
- 3 **No Out-of-Precinct Voting:** No provisional ballots if you attempt to vote in wrong precinct on Election Day. (Jan. 2014)
- 4 **Counties Can't Extend Poll Hours:** If there are long lines or mechanical problems, only the State Board of Elections can extend hours. (Jan. 2014)
- 5 **Changes to Absentee Voting:** Absentee ballots must have signatures of 2 witnesses or 1 notary public (no fee allowed) and must provide one of the following: driver's license or non-operator ID number; last 4 digits of Social Security number; OR a mail document with current address. (Jan. 2014)
- 6 **Registration Rolls Purged:** Remove unqualified or deceased voter names and share data to find NC voters registered in other states. (Jan. 2014)
- 7 **Increased Poll Observers:** Increase to 10 at-large countywide observers from political parties in addition to 3 precinct-specific observers. (Jan. 2014)
- 8 **More Voter Challenges:** Any voter in the county can challenge any other voter in the county. (Jan. 2014)
- 9 **No Pre-Registration of 16- and 17-year-olds:** You must be 18 years old on or before the pending Election Day in order to register. (Sept. 2013)
- 10 **Touch Screen Voting Must Give Paper Ballot:** This paper ballot will be the voter's official record. (Jan. 2018)
